Programme aligned with national priorities and coherent with strategies of Government of Nigeria relating to birth registration

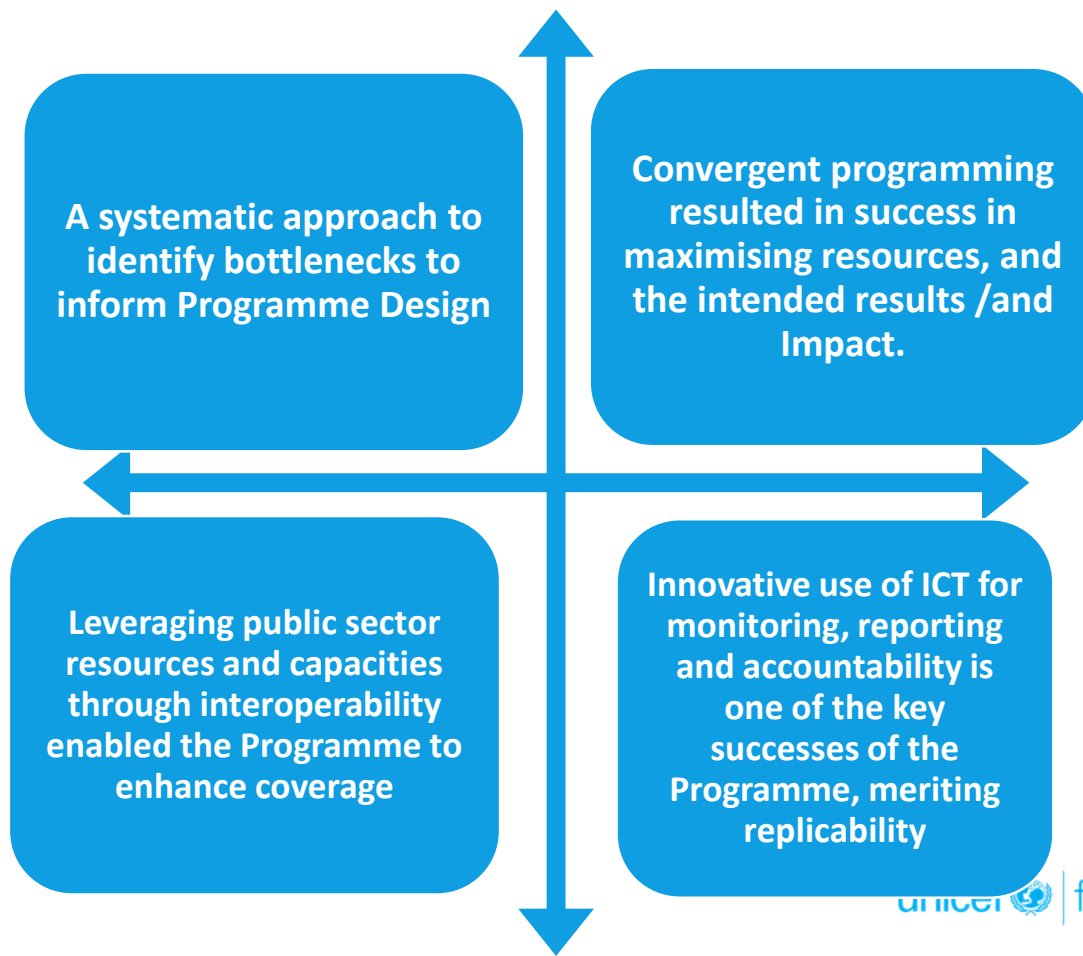
Impact

Approximately 19 Million children under 5 years of age were registered between 2012 and 2016

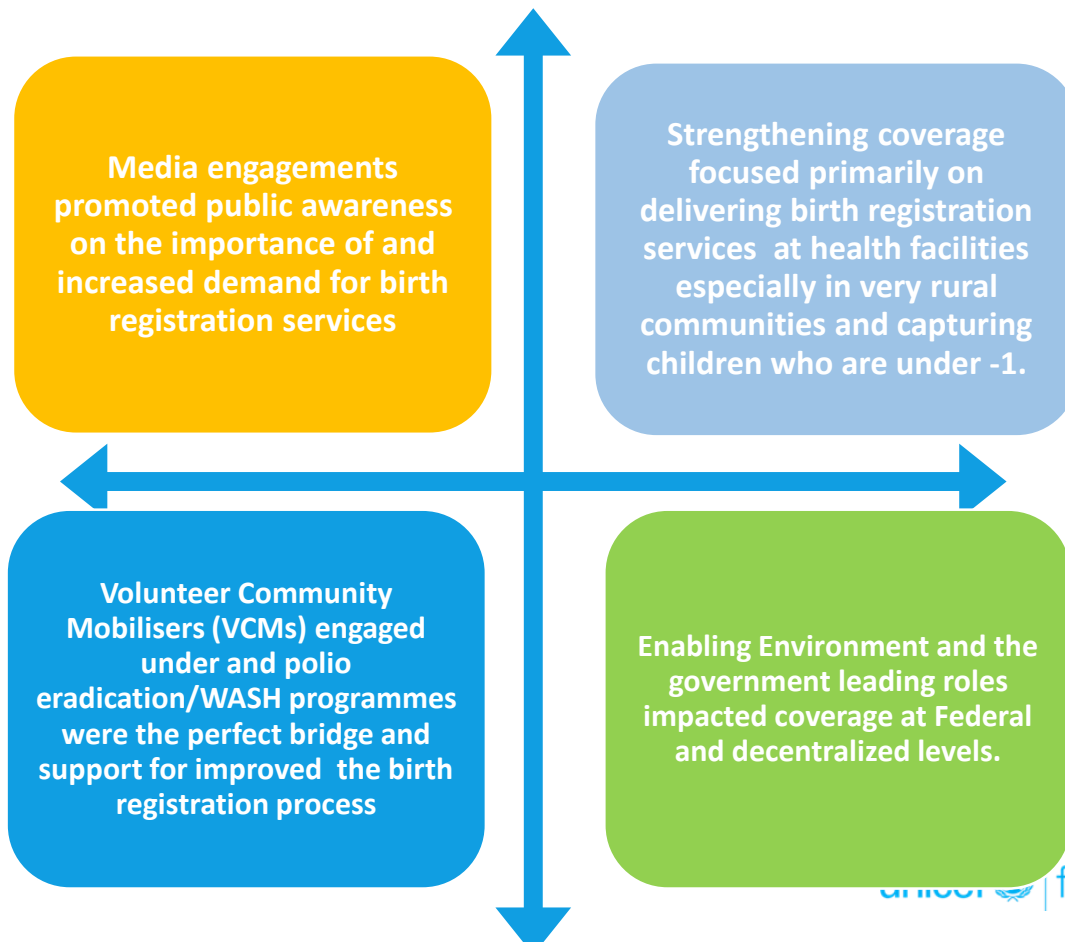
Sustainability

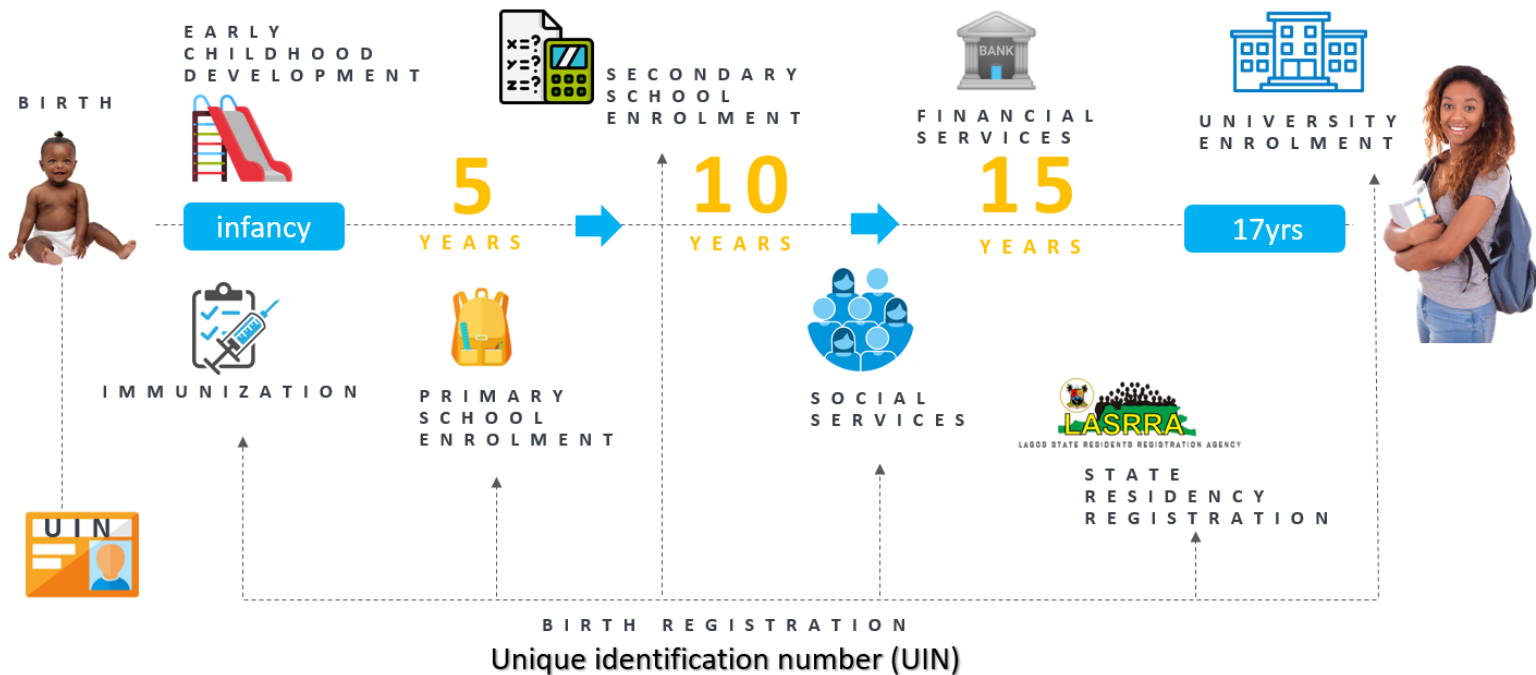

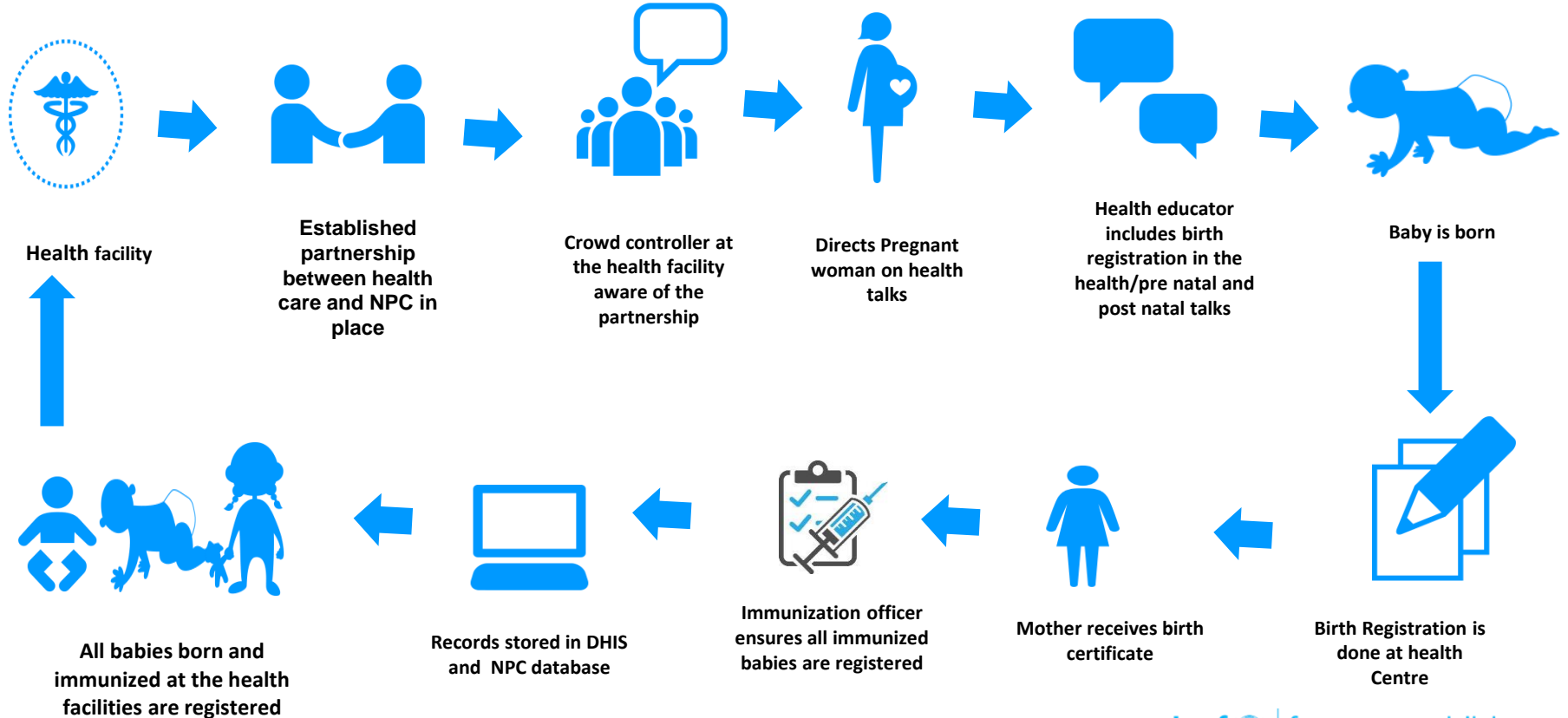


Conceptual Model of Co Creation
